



WHY IS IT SUITABLE FOR HOSPITALITY?

Because of its high performance characteristics of durability, stain resistance and overall beautiful aesthetic, polyurethane is a suitable and cost effective choice for contract and hospitality environments. These fabrics are tested for their performance to ASTM industry standards.





CLEANING & CARE INSTRUCTIONS

In many instances, a clean, damp cloth is all that is needed to remove dirt and grime from the face of the fabric. If further cleaning is required:

Soiled areas should be cleaned as soon as possible. We recommend using non-abrasive, water based cleaners, soap and water. Add 1 tsp of mild liquid dish or laundry detergent to 16 oz of water.

Use a clean cloth dampened with the appropriate cleaning solution and apply to the affected areas. Blot the fabric with the cloth, working from the outer edge of the stained area and moving toward the centre. In order to effectively draw out the stain, renew the cleaning cloth as often as necessary to maintain absorbency.

Rinse cloth with fresh water and wipe affected area to remove any residue from the soap and water. Wipe dry with a clean cloth.

For challenging stains (such as hair oil, soft drinks, chocolate, candy, etc.) wipe affected area with a soft cloth using a mild upholstery cleaner. Rinse cloth with fresh water and wipe affected area to remove any residue. Wipe dry with a clean cloth.
